This half term in Design Technology lessons, Year 1 and 2 children are learning all about different mechanisms to make moving pictures. Before half term commenced, our focus was looking at how to make sliders. The children had a go at making their own based on the story 'The Gingerbread Man'. They did an incredible job, and we had a fantastic time retelling the story through their creative and innovative sliders.



Exploring Materials

FS1 and FS2 pupils this term have been exploring different materials and learning all about them. FS1 worked collaboratively and independently to test different materials and discuss how strong they are, before creating bridges and testing their strength. In FS2, pupils engaged in a Three Little Pigs role play, to hook their imagination and understanding, that some materials are better suited than others. We retold the story of the wolf blowing the houses down made of straw, sticks and bricks, and pupils came to the conclusion that brick is the best material to build with, just as it is in the story!



Number Day

Across the academy, classes celebrated Number Day by coming to school dressed as numbers and fundraised for the NSPCC. Pupils were incredibly creative, dressed as dominoes, number blocks and playing cards. All classes throughout Wincobank engaged in exciting number-related activities and maths challenges, including colouring by number, painting numbers, finding numbers in the sand, singing number songs and making numbers out of playdough. Many families came to join the academy for the celebrations, and it served as a fantastic way to make maths creative and fun!





Collaborative Writing

Year 6 children worked collaboratively to plan a newspaper report based on the search for Ernest Shackleton's ship Endurance. First, the children worked in groups, identifying the crucial knowledge they would need to include in their report and then used their knowledge maps to draft a report together. 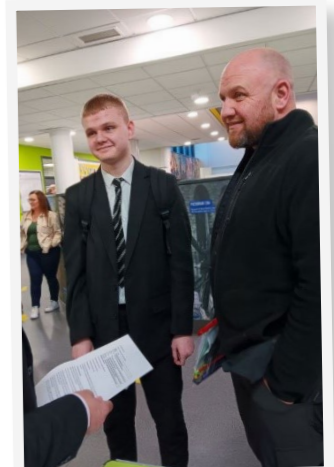
Future Ready
