
We will work with you so you will have:

GET : FAMILIAR

To be successful on your BTEC course you need to know the following:

The Command verbs that you will use in your assignments

COMMAND VERB	WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?		
DESCRIBE	Give details of all relevant features		
EXPLAIN	Give details and reasons to support your views – think why?		
ANALYSE	Look in detail at each part, make links and explain the importance of each		
COMPARE/CONTRAST	Explain the similarities and differences		
DEMONSTRATE	Put the theory you know into practice and show you can carry out an activity		
EVALUATE	Collate what you know, judge the importance or success and back it with evidence!		
JUSTIFY	IFY Give full reasons or evidence to support your opinion – think why?		
RECOMMEND	IEND Weigh up the evidence, and suggest what would be best with reasons		

TYPES OF ASSESSMENT

INTERNAL	Assignments marked by your teachers	You will have a number of Interim Submission deadlines leading to a Final Submission for each assignment. These will be detailed in your Assessment Calendar at the start of the year
EXTERNAL	Controlled exams that are marked by the exam board, Pearson	Dates for these are set by the exam board - you can only complete the exam on this date

TYPES OF UNITS

Core – these are the units that will deliver powerful knowledge and skills on which the rest of your qualification is based. If you fail these, you fail the qualification.

Specialist - these are specifically chosen to expand and broaden your knowledge, skills and understanding within your chosen subject.

You must complete all Core and Specialist units to gain the full qualification.

DEADLINES - You must know these and meet these. See "Need to Know" section for further information.







ASSESSMENT CRITERIA

You will be assessed across the full range of criteria - Pass, Merit and Distinction. Your interim assessment and final assessment tasks will not be criteria specific, instead they will allow you to complete tasks that reflect the full range.

Your interim assessment feedback will tell you if you are on the track to achieve all parts of the task and will give you actions to make improvements needed for your final submission.

PLAGIARISM (MALPRACTICE)

You must produce your **own work** - your assignments show us what you know, understand and what skills you have developed.

You are not allowed to:

- Copy from textbooks or from the internet - you can use textbooks, journals and the internet to back up what you are saying but you must reference these if used.
- Copy from other students, past or present or share your work with each other

If there is evidence that you have plagiarised you run the risk of one or more of the following happening:

Failing the unit

If this is a core unit

 Failing the course and losing your place at the Sixth Form

ESSENTIAL SKILLS

Throughout your BTEC course you will develop lots of different skills, knowledge and understanding. The great thing about a BTEC vocational course is that you will have the opportunity to apply all of these in "Real Life" scenarios and projects.

You will also need to sit exams so need to remember things you have learnt on your course. Recall and retrieval is therefore essential!

Some research and retrieval tips:

Chunking

Put information into chunks. For example, instead of trying to remember these numbers: 2,7,5,3,8,7,9,3,2,6,5,8,9, & 5, try to remember this instead: 2753, 8793, 2658 and 95. Your brain can retain more information if you group it in this way than if you think of each number as a separate piece of information.

Self-Testing

Once you have learnt something, leave it for a week or so and test yourself. If you keep re-testing it will stick!!

Weekly Review

Once per week review your learning. Create a mind-map or flow diagram to show what you have learnt that week – you could do one for each unit.
